

Centenary Celebrations

On Saturday 1st December 2007 Lord Bolton Lodge No.3263 celebrated its 100th birthday.

Consecrated on 13th November 1907 by the Right Honourable Lord Bolton who was Deputy Provincial Grand Master at the time.

It was the sixth lodge to be consecrated in Hull and arranged to meet on a Saturday night to accommodate those brethren who were away with work during the week.

It developed a nickname of the "Commercial Travellers Lodge "

For the Centenary Celebration, the Provincial Grand Master, together with his Deputy and Assistants, was treated to an enlightening Power-Point Presentation about the History of the Lodge given by the Worshipful Master, Alan Shand and the Junior Warden, Colin Bird. The Provincial Grand Master duly presented the 100years warrant and in return was presented with a cheque for the Air Ambulance Appeal by Charity Steward Roy Kaye on behalf of the lodge.

To his great surprise the lodge Director of Ceremonies, Mike Lawson was called forward by the Provincial Grand Master and was awarded the rank of Past Provincial Junior Grand Deacon.

At the subsequent dinner all brethren received an engraved Whisky Tumbler as a memento of a great evening.
